Green Valley Animal League

Jean Davis, who was an 8th grade teacher and curriculum coordinator for 30 years at continental school, married our own **Chet Davis** in 2002 and became the Animal League's first intake and adoption coordinator in 2003. She's been the League's President since 2004.



She told us they place 800 pets for adoption each year, and asked how the impact of that can be measured other than in the smiles of joy they bring to their 600 volunteers and to the people who adopt. Some of the pets work in the community as therapy dogs. The League's onsite thrift store pays for half of the expenses of the animals. The League has spayed or neutered more than 380,000 animals, and they provide help to families that can't afford pet food or need medical care for their pets. Their work is accomplished with the help of the community and more than 600 volunteers. Their motto is "a home for every pet."

The League accepts every pet brought to them, makes sure they are in good health, and works to socialize the pets, train them, and find a good fit for adoption. They even provide post-adoption care. They hold community events promoting adoption, and they have a youth intern program. They are open every day at 1600 W Duval Mine Road; the kennels and thrift store 10 AM to 2 PM.
