Connecting People to Water to Our Rivers



Trevor Hare, a river restoration biologist with the Watershed Management Group, graduated from U of A in 1991 with a degree in ecology and studied for 10 years the impact of suburban development on rattlesnakes and Gila monsters.

Over the last 25 years, he's practiced riparian and upland restoration in our region, and the methodology he's developed has resulted in over \$2 million of restoration work in our region.

Hare said the River Run Network is all about keeping water in the Tucson basin, about restoring Tucson's heritage of flowing creeks and rivers. The primary technique is slowing the flow down at strategic points and allowing the water to soak in. The Network tries to raise awareness and develop connections between organizations, communicate restoration opportunities and goals, connect individual actions (like home landscaping) to watershed health goals, prioritize restoration actions, and highlight restoration progress.

He showed slides that made clear the changes between the early 1900's and present day: we no longer have cottonwoods in downtown Tucson, for example. But if in a number of streamsheds the water can be slowed down (simple rock barriers) and fed back into the aquifer, made shallower and wider, erosion can be slowed and riparian ecology can return.
